

MAYOR'S REPORT

DEAR FELLOW CITIZENS,

For seven years now, I have been proud to present the Mayor's report on the Town's financial position, as prescribed by section 474.1 of the *Cities and Towns Act.*

The Town Council is working to continue providing the services and infrastructure that citizens are entitled to expect. With the measures we have taken pursuant to our Social Development Policy, we are pursuing our efforts to foster citizen engagement.

Our budget and operations take each and every taxpayer's ability to pay into account. Our goal is to maintain our debt serving obligations at a level that is more than acceptable. Thanks to the skills and hard work of Pincourt's managers and employees, the Town Council is proud of the results obtained in 2015.

You will find the full text of my report on the Town's website. In addition, all documents mentioned in this report are available for consultation at Town Hall.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS AS OF DECEMBER 31, 2014

At the end of the 2014 fiscal year, the Town of Pincourt had an accumulated surplus of approximately \$7,996,420, after this year's contribution of just over \$4,815,549.

We are keeping our debt service level below the average values normally deemed to be acceptable by the *Ministère des Affaires municipales et de l'Occupation du territoire*. As a result, we are able to carry out a respectable and reasonable program of repairs and improvements to many Town infrastructures to better serve our community.

To ensure we use the available surplus wisely, the Town Council adopted a resolution last August to create three-year reserves to pay for various work and undertakings, as follows:

LEGAL CONTINGENCIES RESERVE: \$500,000.00

BUILDING AND URBAN FURNITURE MAINTENANCE: \$330,000.00

IT AND NETWORK IMPROVEMENT RESERVE: \$60,000.00

SPECIAL PROJECTS: \$300,000.00

UNALLOCATED SURPLUS AS OF AUGUST 11, 2015 : \$1,030,916.95


OPERATING BUDGETS

According to the quarterly reports produced to date by the Town's various departments, we are in line with our budget projections so far and should end the year with a small budget surplus. However, we note that we are experiencing a slowdown in the Town's economic activity, and revenues generated by the real estate sector are somewhat lower than in recent years.

PROGRAMME TRIENNAL

The three-year program includes a range of projects that the administration intends to achieve on its territory over the next three years.

FUTURE WORK



WORK COMPLETED

We also made improvements in the areas surrounding the Town's schools to encourage students to adopt active transportation (walking, cycling, etc.) while ensuring the areas are as safe as possible.

Also on the safety front, we purchased a pump truck for the Emergency and Fire Protection Department to replace one of its two units, which had reached 20 years of age and was due for replacement in accordance with the risk management plan and *Fire Safety Act*.

WORK IN PROGRESS

We began repairs to pump-house no. 3, located at the corner of chemin Duhamel and $5^{\rm th}$ Avenue. Work should be completed this fall.

In addition, and as expected, development of a portion of the land on 5th Avenue in front of the sports complex has begun, and construction of the new project is proceeding rapidly. As for the sports complex itself, legal problems are no longer weighing on the project's completion and Groupe Thibault should resume work in early 2016 with a view to opening the facility for the start of the 2016-2017 season.


GENERAL GUIDANCE FOR THE YEAR 2016

Operating Budgets

The Quebec government has proposed a new fiscal pact to municipalities. In a nutshell, the government is maintaining the cuts and reductions made in recent years. There are no significant injections of new revenue in the cards for Pincourt except for a few adjustments to selected programs, such as compensation for waste collection.

However, we believe that the impact of various legislative provisions affecting municipal governments in recent years will be felt in 2016. Normally, by this date we should already have been informed of the amounts that various organizations that bill the Town every year will be charging, or various amounts set by legislation. We firmly believe that these organizations have postponed adopting their budgets in the hopes of receiving greater financial assistance from the Quebec government.

It is clear that there has been very little for these organizations and we therefore have to expect substantial increases, whether for the Sûreté du Québec, the Agence métropolitaine de transport or its successor, the Communauté métropolitaine de Montréal and so on. We wish to remind citizens that these sums accounted for nearly 23% of our budget last year.

2016-2017-2018 Three-Year Program

The complete three-year program will be available at Town Hall following its adoption. The largest project is without doubt repairs to a substantial section of chemin Duhamel, estimated at somewhat over \$8,000,000; nearly 50% of that sum will come from the government's gas tax and Quebec contribution program (TECQ), which is the only program so far confirmed in terms of financial support for municipal infrastructure.

In terms of specific projects slated for 2016, the list includes repairs to 5th Avenue between chemin Duhamel and the Bellevue Street right-of-way, to Forest Avenue and to 23rd, 24th and 25th Avenues, the installation of a fitness course at Taillon Park, the waterfront walkway pilot project on chemin Duhamel and finally the construction of new municipal workshops in conjunction with a renovation of the Emergency and Fire Protection Department's fire station and the existing building.

The Council meeting for the adoption of the budget will be held on December 15, 2015 at 7:30 pm at the Omni-Centre. See you there.
