Tree and Environment Day

On May 16th, 2015, the Town of Pincourt held its first Tree and Environment Day at the Olympique Park. This event, in honour of Tree and Forest Month, was an idea of the Town Council. For the occasion, the councillors gave away pine cuttings. Residents also had the chance to pick up bags of compost, filled by scouts from the "16° de L'Île Perrot" troop, for just \$1.

Cars were lined up in the morning to get compost. Also, this day, some people were able to take advantage of a special offer and get a rain barrel and a compost bag for only \$20.



With the Girl Guides of Canada, the mayor and councillors have also planted five trees around the playing structures of the Olympique Park.

INFO-WORK

The year 2015 will be highlighted by some important works on the territory of Pincourt. Many construction sites are to be expected during the summer and fall.

Below, find an overview of the projects:

SHAMROCK PARK: MODERNIZATION OF THE KID'S PLAYGROUND

As of July, the Shamrock Park will show a brand new look signed Techsport. The park will be divided in three zones, including two play structures for 18 months to 5 years old children and another one for 5 to 12 years old. It will also include two sets of swings. The reopening of the park is expected in end of July, depending on the completion of the work.

WATER PAD: CONSTRUCTION OF A WATER RETENTION POND

Do you think that the water pad is a waste of water? Well, environmentalists will be glad to hear that a water retention pond will be built at the corner of Lussier Avenue and Olympique Boulevard to collect water from the water games. A water tanker vehicle will then go to collect the water to maintain the flowers and plantations around the town.

INSTALLATION OF DIGITAL BILLBOARDS

To help inform you better, we will install permanent electronic billboards at two locations in the town. It will announce upcoming events and important dates. At the time of writing, the digital billboards locations remain to be confirmed.

PUMPING STATION - SP3

New sanitary sewer pipes will be installed on 5th Avenue between the Tapis Pincourt and chemin Duhamel. The bike trail, extending from Bellevue Street to 5th Avenue, will be closed temporarily. A new sewer pumping station will be built to replace the existing one on the corner of 5th Avenue and chemin Duhamel.

Detours are to be expected. Local traffic will be permitted.

RECONSTRUCTION OF FOREST AVENUE

Good news! Forest Avenue might not be at its best now, but not for long! This fall, we will start new! The Forest Avenue, between Shamrock Street and de l'Île Boulevard, will be completely rebuilt.

PLANNING AROUND SCHOOLS

EDGEWATER SCHOOL

To ensure smooth traffic flow on the 8th Avenue and Cardinal-Léger Boulevard during rush hours, a sidewalk will be built on Martel Street behind the school. The drop-off and pick-up area for the children by the parents will now be located on Martel street. New traffic signs will be installed on 8th Avenue, Cardinal-Léger Boulevard and Martel Street.

NOTRE-DAME-DE-LORETTE SCHOOL

To secure the school area, a sidewalk will be built on Bellevue Street, from Lussier Avenue to the crosswalk behind the school. To improve the link between Olympique and Bellevue Parks, we will also extend the cycling path to Monseigneur-Langlois Avenue.

ST-PATRICK SCHOOL

To promote active transportation, a sidewalk will also be built on the Shamrock Street, from Forest Avenue to Bayview Street. This new sidewalk will be linked to the new portion of the sidewalk to be built on Forest Avenue between Shamrock Street and de l'Île Boulevard.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

You can put your bins, branches and large items at the roadside the evening before the scheduled pick-up day, after 6:00 pm.

To report a damaged bin, please call 514 453-8981, extension 5.

GARAGE SALES:

Garage sales are allowed during the Labor Day weekend from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm.

Anyone who wishes to advertize a garage sale may put only one sign on their property and no longer than four days before the sale (measuring less than 0.60 m²). The sign must be removed as soon as *Due to high demand, branch pick-up operations can take several days. the sale is over. Posting garage sale signs on street poles is prohibited.

No permits are required to hold a garage sale.

Pilot project: Écocentre de l'île

Vaudreuil-Soulanges, the MRC de Vaudreuil-Soulanges decided to expand its services to the population by opening deposit sites in Rigaud, Saint-Zotique and Pincourt. As this is a pilot project for now, the Écocentre de l'île will be effective until October 17th, 2015.

Already, you may go to the municipal garage to bring specific materials. An attendant will guide you on site. Once at the station of your choice.

Containers 1 and 2

Wood, treated wood and plywood

Exemples: lumber, wood furnitures, wooden pallets, etc.

Containers 3 and 4



Dry construction materials

Exemples: ceramics, gypsum, insulating materials, melamine, glass, windows, plastic or fiberglass, toilet bowls, bathtubs and showers, etc.

Container 5



Excavation materials

Exemples: asphalt, brick, concrete, stone, sand and gravel, etc.

Chêne-Bleu Obstacle Course

On May 20th, during the annual race of Chêne-Bleu High School, students from support and special education classes participated in an obstacle course they have designed themselves.





Started in September 2014, this collaborative project has enabled them to touch several aspects of event organization such as the creation of the logo, the design of

the course, the obstacle construction, etc. With the help of the staff of Pincourt Public Works, they have built wooden structures to serve as obstacles. The highlight of the project was to take part in the race they worked so hard to organize.

For the Town, taking part in this project was a way to meet one of the objectives of its Social Development Policy, that is, the organization of support activities for teenagers at risk of dropping out of school.

A Micro-library at Trotter Park
