

Pincourt 2022 Budget

Pincourt, December 23, 2021 – The Town of Pincourt’s new property assessment roll confirms an average increase of 24% in the value of properties on its territory. By reducing the residential tax rate from \$0.6990 to \$0.6079 per \$100 of assessment, the Town Council has capped the tax increase at 6.02%.

This tax increase is necessary following on the 2021 tax freeze and, combined with a significant increase in co-payments (11.8%) and major contracts (23.57%), which include all services provided to the population such as garbage collection, recycling collection, Sûreté du Québec services, etc. The Town Council’s decision preserves our services, while ensuring the sustainability of our infrastructure. Moreover, the Town Council had to consider the inflation rate of over 5%. Consequently, in 2022, the 6.02% tax adjustment will result in a municipal tax bill increase of \$173.64 for an average home valued at \$371,835.

The Town's sound financial management over the past few years has allowed it to grow reserves for the implementation of several important projects, totaling more than \$7.74 million.

"Our priority is the quality of life and safety of Pincourt citizens. The Town Council continues to work towards this goal, " said new Pincourt Mayor, Claude Comeau.
