Sustainable Development Policy **Now Adopted**

Following a major consultation process that began in November 2018 and targeted both citizens and its own employees, the Town of Pincourt finally launched its very first Sustainable Development Policy last June 5.

With the participation of its elected representatives, its employees and citizens, the Town of Pincourt is committed to acting responsibly in regard to the environmental and to being socially inclusive, all while adopting a transparent and cooperative approach and promoting its culture, identity and multicultural heritage.

Last August, the Town distributed a guide outlining the policy's major thrusts, including the values it espouses and the objectives established for every aspect of sustainable development.

The guide is available online, under Citizen's Services / Environment / Sustainable Development Policy.



Food Waste Collection -Phase 2

In October 2018, the Town of Pincourt started collecting household food waste, targeting family dwellings and multi-unit buildings with up to four units.

This fall, the collection will be expanded to include multi-unit buildings with more than four units.

Multi-unit buildings received their 240-litre brown bins in September. The first collection will be on October 7.

Review of 2018-2019 Green Project Activities

The Green Project is an urban agriculture initiative developed by the Town of Pincourt in cooperation with École secondaire du Chêne-Bleu.

The project aims to give all the school's students a chance to learn how to grow fruits and vegetables. The project is also entrepreneurial in nature, enabling students to develop relationships with several entrepreneurs in the region.

The Green Project in numbers

- Organic food baskets produced for 15 clients
- 20 fruit trees planted, thanks to a grant from Tree Canada
- 10 additional gardens (4 x 12 feet) created, thanks to a \$1,500 prize from the Carrefour jeunesse emploi
- Five oak benches built for the school's inner courtyard
- 15 students learned to produce microgreens
- 65 Secondary III students learned how to grow oyster mushrooms
- 60 Secondary I students participated in a composting project with the school cafeteria
- A total of 350 students took part in in producing seedlings and various garden work
