CONSTRUCTION OF THE FIRE STATION AND MUNICIPAL GARAGE

Work is progressing well, and delivery of the building is scheduled for May. A few projects, including the parking lot and connection between the two buildings, will be required before any activities can be transferred, however. The building is expected to open in the fall of 2021.

ANIMAL CONTROL - NEW PROCEDURE

Have you lost an animal? Have you seen a stray animal? You should know that the procedure for reporting a lost animal has changed. From now on, animal control will be supervised by the Safety Patrol and SPCA West.

To report a lost animal, you must call **3-1-1** to contact the municipal patrol. If you find a dead animal on your property or on the public road, please call the same number.

However, if you find a wild animal on your property, contact SPCA West directly at 514-566-5678.

LICENCES FOR CATS AND DOGS

We'd like to remind you that you must obtain a licence from the Town for all cats and dogs. Available at a cost of \$30, a licence is valid for the life of the animal.

If an animal runs away or experiences a problem, an animal register makes it easier to identify the owner.

- A maximum of four animals per residence is allowed, including a maximum of two dogs.
- When walking a dog outside your property, it must be on a leash that has a maximum length of two metres (six feet) at all times.
- You should immediately pick up your pet's excrement and dispose of it in a hygienic manner.
- It is forbidden to let dogs walk on private property.

ENVIRONMENTAL GRANT PROGRAM

Did you know that the Town of Pincourt allocates an annual budget of \$10,000 to its Environmental Grant Program?

The Town offers various grants to encourage the adoption of environmentally responsible practices. Available as a cash rebate, these grants aim to cover part of the cost of purchasing various sustainable products.

Grants offered:

- Cloth diapers
- Shredding blades • Low-flow toilets
- Rainwater harvesting barrels • A tree at the birth of a child
- Shoreline revitalization

You must meet the requirements of the specific program to be eligible for a grant.

WATERING

With spring comes yard work and gardening. That's why we'd like to remind you of our watering guidelines.

Watering of lawns or other vegetation with removable sprinklers, porous hoses or automatic watering systems is only permitted from 8:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. on the following days, unless the Town declares a total ban on watering.



It is an offence to water outside this period.

WATERING PERMIT

You can obtain a permit to water a new lawn (sod or seed) for 12 consecutive hours on the day of installation. Then, the watering period continues for the next 15 days. You'll be able to water between 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. and between 8 p.m. and 10 p.m.

Only one authorization certificate per year can be issued for an address.

Please note that no certificates are issued between July 1 and August 31 due to water conservation issues during periods of high usage.



BOAT RAMP PERMIT

While you wait for boating season to kick off, why not get your parking permit to use one of our boat ramps now.

Free of charge, this permit is available at the Urban Planning Department. You'll need to provide proof of residence and the registration number of your trailer.

Remember that only Pincourt residents are allowed to park their cars and watercraft trailers in areas with a boat ramp.

A TREE FOR MY NEIGHBOURHOOD

The Town of Pincourt, in collaboration with GRAME, offers a grant program for the planting of trees at a modest cost.

The Regroupement des éco-quartiers (REQ) and the Société de verdissement du Montréal métropolitain (Soverdi), in collaboration with the Town of Pincourt, invite you to plant trees on your property to enrich urban biodiversity and increase the green cover in your neighbourhood.

Through <u>A Tree for my Neighbourhood</u>, you can purchase up to two trees at a small cost.

The complete selection features close to fifty tree species.

Cost

Here are the prices of the subsidized trees:

- \$25: Regular tree
 \$35: Fruit tree
- \$45: Conifer
- \$55: Exceptional tree

When the number of trees provided for in the grant is sold out, the trees will be available at the regular price.

- \$85: Regular tree
 \$95: Fruit tree
- \$105: Conifer\$115: Exceptional tree

Planting

Planting is not included in the grant. However, GRAME offers a professional planting service, payable online when you order.

Additional cost for planting:

- \$90 for one tree
- \$45 for each additional tree

Conditions

- You must be a Pincourt resident.
- There is a limit of two trees per household.



Please note that these trees are intended for new planting and are not to be used for replanting in the context of felling work authorized by the Town and requiring a permit.

PILOT PROJECT: PINCOURT WATER SPORTS CENTRE

Opening this summer

The Water Sports Rental Kiosk in Bellevue Park will open in mid-June and offer rentals on kayaks, paddle boards, pedal boats and one canoe. Priority will be given to Pincourt residents for rentals. Identification will be required.

This two-year pilot project could become permanent depending on citizen response.

TOUS PIÉTONS!

A SUCCESS STORY!

Results show that, after the new speed display sign was installed on Forest Avenue between Shamrock and de l'Île, 94% of motorists respect the 50 km/h speed limit.*

This is proof that our speed displays have a significant impact on speeding on our roads. *Based on readings taken between December 10, 2020 and January 10, 2021.

MASS NOTIFICATION SYSTEM

In the summer of 2020, a warning siren was installed in Shamrock Park to alert nearby citizens in the event of a major accident. In March, citizens received an information leaflet explaining what to do if the siren goes off.
