Civil Security

On August 9, a torrential rainstorm affected a large part of Pincourt. An average of 190 mm of rain fell in Pincourt, and the Town stepped in to help ease the situation for those affected.

Here are the actions that were taken:

- Suspension of renovation permit fees by the Urban Planning Department.
- Collection and disposal of construction materials by the Public Works teams.
- Emotional support for affected residents through St. John Ambulance's canine therapy teams and Salvation Army volunteers.
- Establishment of a subsidy for the installation and purchase of backwater valves in residences.
- Climate change initiatives (underground infrastructure upgrades and reforestation).
- All Town teams contributed to the recovery efforts following the torrential rain on August 9.
- Post-Debby risk communication panel (face-to-face and virtual).

Temporary winter shelters:

• Only one seasonal carport is permitted per lot, from October 15, 2024 to April 15, 2025 and must be installed in driveway.

Caution: Remember to clean your temporary shelters thoroughly to avoid collapse.

Summer recreational equipment (boats, trailers, etc.):

• The **deadline** for parking and storing equipment is **November 15.**

If you are a private snowplow operator on the Pincourt territory, be sure to get a permit for the 2023-2024 winter season.

For a renewal, please only indicate any changes. It is unnecessary to fill in a new form.

WINTER PARKING

As of **November 15, 2024, and until April 1, 2025** inclusively, motorists will be able to park their cars **on the street, during the day**, as follows, unless otherwise posted:

- On the street side with even-numbered addresses, on even-numbered days (e.g.: November 16, I park my car on the side with even-numbered street addresses).
- Odd-numbered street addresses, on odd-numbered days (e.g.: November 17, I park my car on the odd-numbered side of the street).

Reminder: It is **forbidden** to park on the street **overnight**, between midnight and 7 a.m.

WINTER PARKING LOTS

In anticipation of winter, you can purchase a vignette for one of the parking spaces available.

Cost of permit: \$50 per vehicule

Payment: cash, cheque or Interac

The amount disbursed will cover the costs of snow removal and parking space maintenance.

Permit validity: for the 2024-2025 winter season **Procedure:** Complete the **Night Parking Form**






