2025 MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

The Town of Pincoart is currently looking for **election workers** for the upcoming 2025 municipal elections, whether for advance polling in October or for **Election Day on November 2, 2025**.

There are four positions available:

Daily pay ranges from \$200 to \$300 depending on the role.

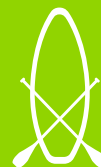
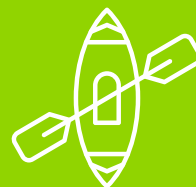




CENTRE NAUTIQUE NAUTICAL CENTRE

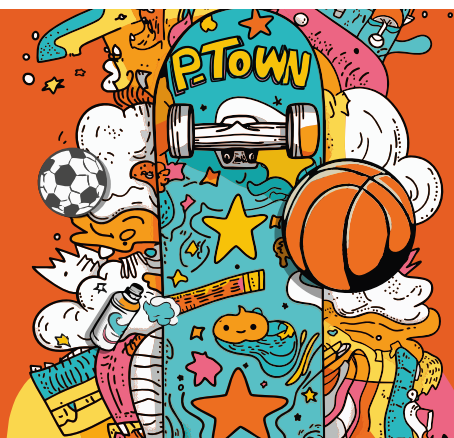

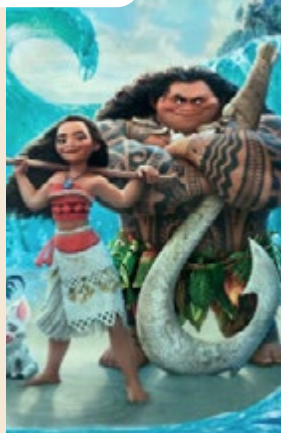
