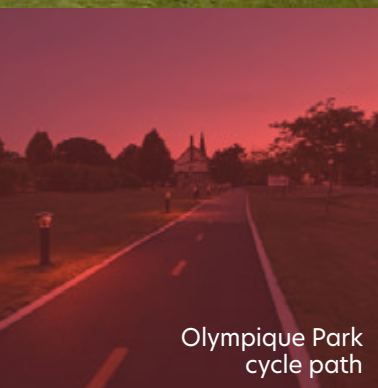

CIVIL SECURITY

Together, let's be ready!



On April 13, 2026, the municipalities of Pincourt, Très-Saint-Rédempteur, Pointe-Fortune, Rigaud, Sainte-Marthe, and Sainte-Justine-de-Newton signed an agreement to establish an intermunicipal civil protection initiative. This initiative establishes an effective organizational structure to ensure an optimal response to emergency situations, in accordance with the law.

By-law - WATERING

A quick reminder of the by-law on water use:

Watering periods

Watering of lawns, hedges, trees, shrubs or other plants, distributed in particular by portable sprinklers, by an automatic watering system or by porous hoses, is only permitted on **Mondays and Thursdays, between 8 p.m. and 10 p.m.**

Watering distributed by portable sprinklers, by an automatic watering system or by porous hoses is **prohibited** on other days and **outside the permitted periods.**



Make way for good weather, make way for renovations!

Don't forget to apply for your permits for your renovation projects: Pools, patios, sheds, fences, etc.

How to do it? See the web page [Permit Application](#).

You do not need to apply for a permit for the following projects:

- Changing roof shingles
- Interior and exterior painting work
- Gutter installations

Construction work

It is **permitted** to carry out or have carried out construction, repair or demolition work on a building:

- Monday to Thursday, from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.;
- Friday, from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.;
- Saturday and Sunday, from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Lawnmowers and power tools

It is **permitted** to use a lawnmower or lawn tractor, a strimmer, a chainsaw, a leaf blower or any other power tool:

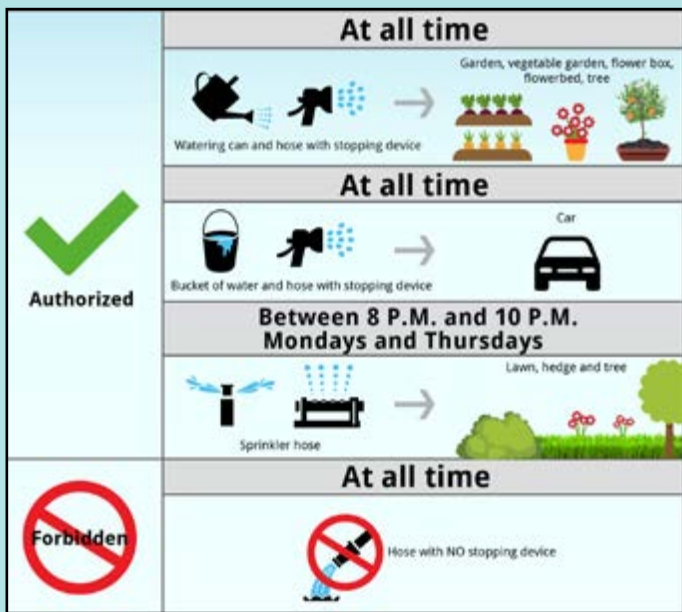
- Monday to Thursday: 7 a.m. to 10 p.m.;
- Friday: 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.;
- Saturday, Sunday and public holidays: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Green waste is collected every second Wednesday, from May to November.
Residues accepted: garden residues, flowerbed residues, grass and leaves, lawn, hedge clippings, small branches less than 1 cm in diameter.

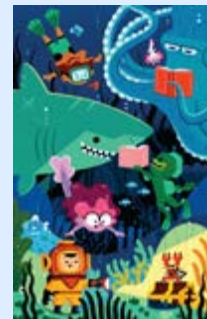

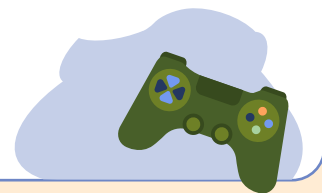

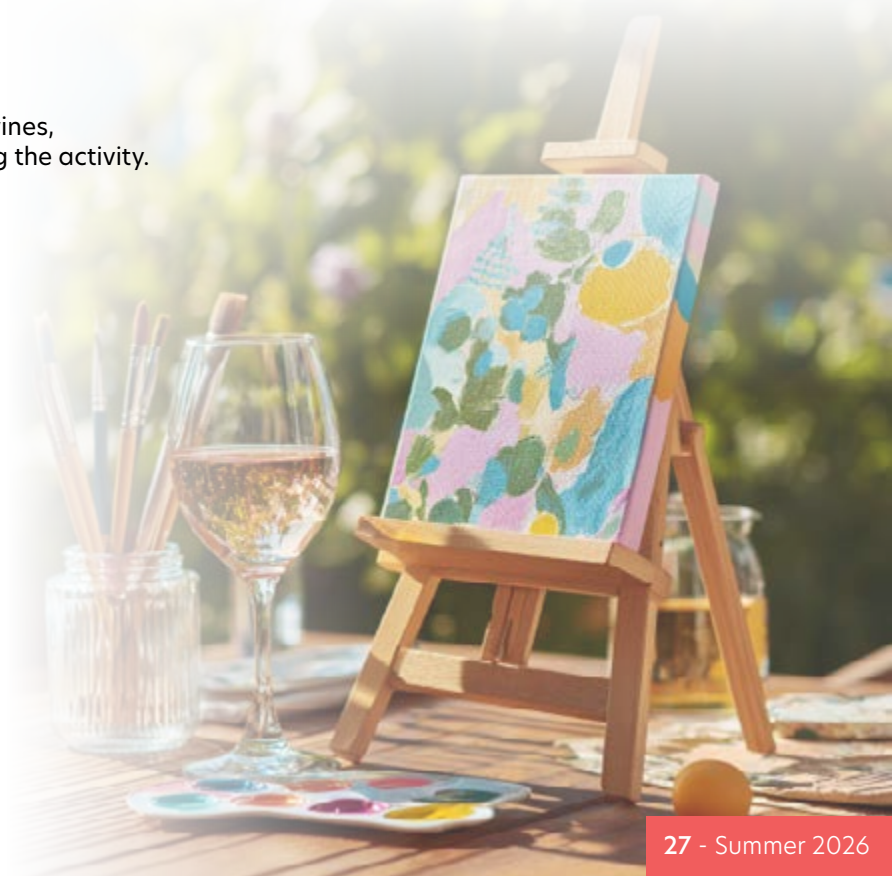
