New Watering Regulation

The cities of Pincourt, Notre-Dame-de-l'Île-Perrot, and Terrasse-Vaudreuil have jointly harmonized their respective watering regulations to protect the environment and raise awareness about excessive water consumption.

The new watering schedule for vegetation is as follows:

- Mondays and Thursdays, between 8:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m.;
- Watering is prohibited on other days and outside of the permitted times.

(By-Law 841 - Regulation regarding the use of water from the municipal aqueduct)

PLAZA TOWN

Construction of the skatepark and pumptrack

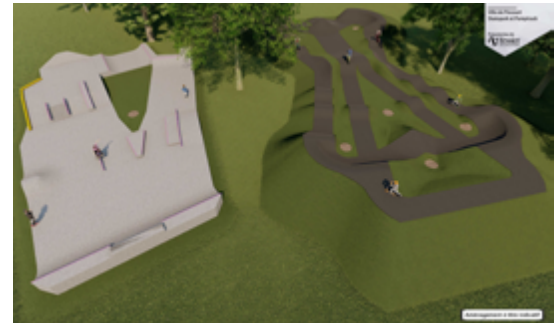
The Pincourt Municipal Council has recognized the need for the town to provide infrastructure for both younger and older residents to have fun.

After several discussions and analyses, the decision has been made to redesign the skatepark at Olympique Park to enhance the range of activities available. This new design will be created by professionals from Tessier, in collaboration with local experts from the extreme sports scene, including Daniel Vezina, the designer of the plan.

The future location will offer a wide variety of features, such as quarter pipes, rails, ramps, and jumps, designed for skateboarders of all skill levels. The pump track, on the other hand, will be perfectly suited for cyclists, rollerbladers, and skateboarders, providing a smooth and dynamic track.

"This new facility will provide the residents of Pincourt with a unique opportunity to safely engage in skateboarding and BMX. We had a need for infrastructure for the young people of Pincourt, and I believe that this new venue will bring joy to many," stated Mayor Claude Comeau.

The official opening is scheduled for summer 2023.

COUNCIL MEETINGS

At town council meetings, elected representatives come together to make decisions for the benefit of the town in the form of by-laws or resolutions. In Pincourt, the Town Council holds its meetings on the second Tuesday of every month.

If necessary, the Town Council may also call special meetings during the year.

LICENSE: CATS AND DOGS

It is your responsibility to obtain a permanent non-transferable license for the lifetime of your dog or cat. This measure helps establish a registry of pets in Pincourt.

License Cost:

\$30 (non-divisible and non-refundable)

How to obtain a license

You must fill out the online form "[Animal Registration](#)".

Please return the duly filled out form:

- By email: taxes@villepincourt.ca;
- In person, at City Hall, by appointment at 514 453-8981 ext. 326;
- At City Hall, in the drop box at the entrance of the building;
- By mail: Pincourt City Hall, 919 chemin Duhamel, Pincourt, Quebec, J7W 4G8.

You will receive a metal tag by mail or in person, which your animal must wear at all times.

Regulation - MOWERS AND TRIMMERS

It is prohibited to use a lawnmower, a lawn tractor, a string trimmer, a chainsaw, a leaf blower, or any other motorized tool before 10 a.m. and after 4 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays, and public holidays.

Regulation - CONSTRUCTION WORK

It is prohibited to carry out or have construction, repair, or demolition work on a building from Sunday to Friday, between 8 p.m. and 7 a.m., and from Friday to Sunday, between 8 p.m. and 10 a.m.

Regulation - WATER

The regulation regarding water usage has changed. Here is the new regulation in effect:

Vegetation Watering

Manual watering, using a hose equipped with an automatic shut-off device, of a garden, vegetable patch, flower box, planter, flowerbed, shrub, or **newly planted tree** (to encourage tree planting) is allowed at any time.

Watering Schedules

The watering of lawns, hedges, trees, shrubs, or other vegetation using portable sprinklers, an **automated irrigation system or porous hoses for watering is authorized only on Mondays and Thursdays, between 8 p.m. and 10 p.m.**

The watering using portable sprinklers, automatic irrigation systems, or porous hoses is prohibited on other days and outside the permitted periods.

Regulation - POOL AND SPA

Pool and spa

The complete filling of a swimming **pool is authorized only once a year**, which must be done **between midnight and 6 a.m.** However, it is **authorized to**

use water from the water supply for the purpose of setting up a new pool to maintain the shape of the structure.

The complete filling of a spa is authorized three times during the same year.

Regulation - RECREATIONAL VEHICLE STORAGE

Until November 1, 2023, the following recreational vehicles **are allowed in the front yard:**

- Campers
- Trailer tents
- Boats
- All-terrain vehicles
- Motor homes
- Trailers

Reminder - BIN PLACEMENT

A little reminder to put your bins in your driveway (garbage, recycling, and compost). Bins placed in the street interfere with snow removal, pedestrian safety, and road traffic.

GREEN WASTE

Accepted waste: garden waste, flower bed waste, grass and leaves, grass clippings, small branches less than 1 cm in diameter.
Leaf collection will take place from *May to November, every 2 weeks, on Wednesdays.*



BRANCHES

Branch collection takes place every 4th week of the month.
Branches must be placed at the curb by Monday morning. Due to high demand, the collection of branches may take place over several days.
The large end of the branches must be facing the street.

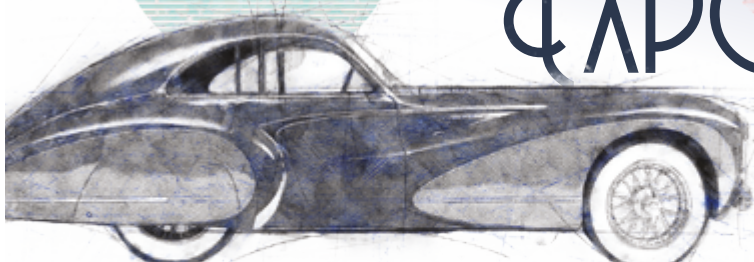

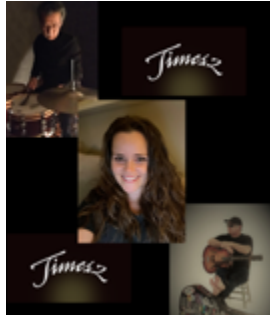

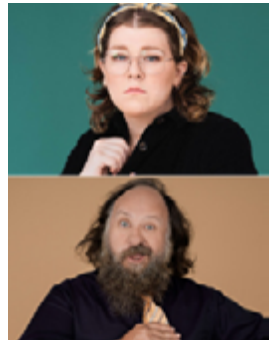
